PAYMENT TERMS:

- 1- UPON REGISTRATION 1 600 \$
- 2- FIRST INSTALLMENT: before the first day of school 18 400 \$
- 3- SECOND INSTALLMENT: January 31st, The remaining sum

N.B.: Foreign students must have health insurance. It must be purchased before leaving their country. You can visit an international insurance company such as *Ingle International* or use your own, if it covers international expenses. We can also purchase an insurance for you, for around 600\$. You must provide proof of insurance when you get to school. An American visa is advised for short trips with school or host family.



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Note a: The administrative fees include all forms of communication and administrative work. The amount is non-refundable even if the student is absent or leaves over the course of the year. If the visa request is rejected, the refund will be granted upon presentation of the rejection letter from the embassy.

Note b: Apart from the tuition fees, this amount includes the membership of the Parents Association and the related fees (students fund, educational material).

Note c: The accommodation is provided from Sunday night to Friday afternoon. Meals and laundry services are included in the accommodation fees.

Note d: (Optional: student can stay with relatives). Homestay weekend fees include the process of finding a homestay family for weekends, pedagogical days, breaks and holidays.

Note e: This amount applies to activities such as “Snow Day”, ski nights, fitness training and other activities off the premises of the institution (Arbraska, White Face, waterpark, cyclocamping, ...).

Note f: This account is used to cover the following charges: medical care, medication, refresher courses, short trips, additional transportation, school uniform (approximately \$ 500), CAQ and study permit (\$ 600), weekend bus (\$ 1,100), school supplies, fee for a private room (\$ 565), legalization of report card (\$ 125), as well as other expenses that may arise over the course of the year. The part that will not have been used will be transferred back to you or kept in the account if the student is readmitted. If there are extra expenses, it will be charged to you. (see details on page 3)

Note g: The immersion classes are mandatory for the allophones who are struggling in French. The courses for beginners are given 3 to 4 times a week. To complete the immersion process, customized classes may be considered for the second and third years.

Note h: The iPad will belong to the student. It includes the installation of the needed software, apps and the services of the computer technician. If instead the student brings his own iPad (at least an iPad 5th generation), around \$ 130 will be charged for reinitializing the device and required applications.

The Collège may send out invoices for expenses that may not have been included (refresher courses or supplementary courses, special activities, trips, optional participation in the Parcours passion program, including the elite sports, and much more).

After March 10th, we have fewer spots, so new registrations could be placed on a waiting list.



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DEPOSIT FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

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This amount of \$4,000 is a deposit. For example, it can be used to cover some of the following charges:
